

ENJOY THE AUSTRALIAN BOTANIC GARDEN MOUNT ANNAN

The Australian Botanic Garden Mount Annan showcases a gorgeous display of Australian flora amongst 416 hectare of rolling hills, lakes, lawns and gardens. It features themed gardens with BBQ and picnic facilities, a café, walking tracks, a playground, visitor centre (which includes a plant nursery and gift shop), as well as interactive sculptures. The Garden is home to the internationally significant scientific research facility, the Australian PlantBank.

Spring is a great time to visit the Connections Garden to see the the magnificent Paper daisies on display from early September through to the end of October.





VISIT THE HISTORIC TOWN OF CAMDEN

Camden's unique heritage unfolds in the collection of historic properties scattered through the town centre. The Heritage Walking Tour brochure takes you on a self-guided exploration of Camden's rich history.



WANDER AROUND CAMDEN TOWN FARM

Originally a 52 hectare dairy farm bequeathed to the local community by the late Miss Llewella Davies. A unique green space on the flood plain surrounding Camden. The Town Farm is a working farm, grazing dairy and beef cattle and growing fodder while using sustainable farming practices.



Macarthur Park opened in 1906 and is made up of different areas to explore, including a heritage rose garden; Wisteria Walk; the Cenotaph honouring World War One soldiers; and a shelter built in 1913 in memory of Mrs Elizabeth Macarthur-Onslow.







The Camden Show showcases excellence in agriculture, attracting visitors and competitors from all over New South Wales and is just one hour from Sydney's central business district.

The first Camden Show was held on Wednesday 17th, Thursday 18th and Friday 19th March in 1886 and has been a great family favourite event ever since. Nowadays, the Camden Show is held over two big days with lots of attractions, exhibitions and competitions. Friday 19th and Saturday 20th March 2021 celebrates the 135th annual Camden Show. The show maintains the same rural charm and agricultural focus from when it first began.

The Camden Show Society Committee organise two days packed with exciting things to do at Camden Showground. You'll find displays, exhibitions and demonstrations on country pastimes like the whip cracking competition and spinning and weaving demonstrations.

Different pavilions are set up for you to get the best opportunity to really experience a country show. At the Arts





& Craft Pavilion you'll find everything from your favourite cooking items, flowers, home brewing and photography to jams and preserves. It really is a cultural delight!

The Kids Interactive Tent provides hands-on educational fun for all to enjoy, whilst the Poultry Pavilion showcases chickens, ducks, turkeys, bantams and eggs.





Camden TOWN CENTRE

As the heart of the Camden Local Government Area (LGA), the Camden Town Centre is valued by the local community and visitors for its unique and attractive character. As the historical centre of the LGA, the Town Centre has retained much of its rural history, agricultural pastureland, heritage buildings and cultural infrastructure. It is frequented by residents, local workers and visitors from across Greater Sydney and beyond, who come to enjoy its heritage and historic assets and boutique offerings.



The Town Centre's largely human scale, fine-grain and eclectic but walkable grid of streets and pedestrian laneways, makes it highly accessible for exploration.



This well-preserved original town layout is the site of Camden's arts and culture precinct, a collection of historic buildings and sites, a range of eateries and boutiques, and a collection of Jacaranda and other mature trees which add vibrancy to the town and complement its heritage buildings.



The town centre has a distinct and attractive character that is formed by the integration of a range of unique qualities. The location of the town adjoining the Nepean River floodplain provides a semi-rural setting and a sense of arrival upon entry from the north. The town's-built form captures the early history, culture, and story of its rich beginnings. A collection of fine examples of early Australian architecture remains, creating a distinct old world, country town feel.



The town centre is surrounded by open spaces such as the Camden Town Farm and Camden Bicentennial Equestrian Park, and offers heritage walks and activities that complement the unique offering of the township.




Camden Town Centre contains a range of niche and boutique retailers, offering lifestyle goods and services. These small businesses have a strong connection to the town and surrounding communities and are part of the town's vibrant tapestry and its attractiveness to locals and visitors

The town centre has a wide selection of historic pubs, wine bars, restaurants and cafes, that serve up a diverse range of cuisines which are inspired by traditions from around the world. Many restaurants also proudly use regional produce to create authentic dining experiences.

The arts and culture precinct clustered along the southern end of John Street reflects the town centres' cultural richness, which is built on its heritage, rural setting, community events, and cultural facilities.

History

Camden has a rich and complex history, starting with the Indigenous groups who lived in the area, the Dharawal, Dharug and Gundungarra people.

Shortly after the European settlement of Sydney, a number of cattle strayed from their herdsmen and made their way south to fertile pastures. As a result, the area around Camden was known for a time as the 'Cowpastures'.

John Macarthur was granted 5,000 acres in the Cowpastures in 1805 to develop the Australian wool industry. Macarthur named the estate 'Camden Park'. Since the earliest days, Camden Park has been central to Australia's history and agricultural heritage, with the establishment of wheat farming and dairying in the region and Australia's first commercial vineyard.

Camden Museum contains a rich collection of Camden's historical artefacts including photographs, maps, clothing, uniforms, furniture, musical instruments and badges.

Formed in 1957, Camden Historical Society Inc. is instrumental in keeping history alive in the Camden area through the Museum, and is responsible for the preservation and display of this heritage.

The history of the Camden district is as old as Australia itself, and this unique heritage unfolds in the exhibited stories and displays you will encounter as you wander through the large collection of Aboriginal and 20th century material, which has been donated by the people of the town and region.





Camden Museum also offers group tours. If you are interested in seeing some of the rich history of Camden Town Centre and the region, a guided tour is also available. Please contact Camden Museum for more details.

Belgenny Farm is in the historic Camden Park Estate, the famous home of agricultural pioneers Elizabeth and John Macarthur. The Farm dates back to 1805 and includes Belgenny Cottage built in 1820. Belgenny Farm is the oldest collection of farm buildings in Australia.

Today, the property is a major educational centre with direct links to Australia's agricultural history. It offers educational and environmental tours, giving young people and special interest groups a chance to learn about agriculture and its history in New South Wales

Belgenny Farm also offers a unique setting for weddings and other special occasions and hosts a number of themed annual events.

Built in 1894 as a military drill hall, the brick front was added by the Camden AH & I Society in 1936, together with the



entrance to Onslow Park. The Hall is owned by the Camden Show Society and used by the community.

CAMDEN COURT HOUSE

Camden Court House was built on land set aside for this purpose by James and William Macarthur at the time the town allotment plans were laid down. The brothers also offered 100 pounds



towards the cost of building. The first buildings on the site were a timber lock-up and Chief Constable's residence. The present building was commenced in 1855 and completed in 1857, with cells underneath and at the rear. The building was designed during William Weaver's term as Government Architect. A new lock-up was built to replace the old one between 1859-61.



CAMDEN POLICE STATION

35 John Street, Camden

Camden Police Barracks were built in 1878. Earlier, the police presence was maintained with a timber lock-up and adjoining residence for the Chief Constable on the side of the present courthouse. The barracks are a good example of the police buildings during that period. The verandah was once enclosed but has been fully restored in recent times.

CAMDEN LIBRARY, MUSEUM AND FORMER FIRE STATION

A glass galleria now joins the Library, Museum and former Fire Station, creating an exciting cultural and heritage precinct in the heart of Camden. The Camden Museum, run by the Camden Historical Society, is based here and features a range of items relating to the history of Camden. You will find the Camden Area Family History Society in the research room next door to the museum.

Opened in 1866 as the Camden School of Arts, the Camden Library has transformed over the years. The two-storey addition at the rear of the building was built in 1900. In 1963, the front two-storey section was demolished. The building that now houses the library was completed in 1964 using the cleaned bricks from the old School of Arts.

Camden Park House was the long-term vision of Captain John Macarthur in

1805 when he received a grant of 5,000 acres (4,046 hectare). The building and design began in 1832 and completed in 1835, a year after the death of John Macarthur.



Architect, John Verge, designed the mansion in a Palladian style with central two-storev block with one-storey wings and extensions at each side. Camden Park House, which has become one of the great mansions of Australia, is still occupied by the Macarthur family and is thought to be one of the oldest residences in the country still occupied by descendants. The family burial ground is located nearby and is the last resting place of John Macarthur and his direct descendants


Descendants of John and Flizabeth Macarthur still live in the house today and host an annual open weekend in September/October. Private group tours are offered, based on availability.

Located in the heart of historic Camden and set in picturesque rural landscape, Camden Town Farm was originally a 52 hectare dairy farm that was bequeathed to the local community by the late Miss Llewella Davies. It is a unique green space on the floodplain surrounding Camden.

The Town Farm uses sustainable farming practices and remains a working farm, grazing dairy and beef cattle and growing fodder. The farm hosts a range of activities, including the weekly Camden Fresh Produce Market. community gardens and events including TASTE Camden.

Take stroll through the farm on the accessible Miss Llewella Davis Pioneers Walkway, through riparian zones, pastoral grazing and cropping paddocks and scenic views of Camden and the Nepean River.

The original timber barn and surrounding buildings are very popular with artists and photographers alike, particularly for wedding and promotional photos. Bookings are essential for events, weddings and photography.

Camden Valley Inn is a favourite for locals and passing visitors, and it's not hard to see why. With a strong history,



top chefs with access to delicious locally grown produce, award-winning food, and plenty of indoor and outdoor space for dining, the Inn's popularity has increased significantly in the last decade, making it an iconic dining destination in the area.

CAMFLOT



Yirkham Lane, Kirkham

Camelot stands on the site of explorer John Oxley's Kirkham Mill. John Horbury Hunt designed Camelot for James White of Cranebrook in the late 1880s. It is constructed from brick and has romantic silhouette of turrets, chimneystacks,





gables, arched verandahs and projecting bays. Camelot was reportedly built with the winnings from 'Chester', a racehorse that won the Melbourne Cup in 1877.

Camelot was featured on the popular Foxtel television series A Place to Call Home.

Carrington Centennial Hospital for Convalescents, the first of its kind in NSW, was officially opened on 20 August 1890. The hospital owes its existence to the generosity of Mr William Henry Paling, a Dutchman who arrived in Sydney in 1853. Mr Paling gave his farm, Grasmere, together with \$10,000 as a centennial gift to the people of NSW. The hospital is named after Lord Carrington who was Governor of NSW



at the time of the colony's centenary. The architect for the project was Harry C. Kent.

Today, Carrington is a blend of the old and the new providing accommodation for older persons consisting of a nursing home, day centre, Pailing Court Hostel, Mary MacKillop Hostel and self-care units.

COBBITTY VILLAGE

Cobbitty Village was originally named 'Cobbedee' by Governor Macquarie, and later was renamed 'Cubbady Farm' by Gregory Blaxland when he was granted land here in 1812.

The village of Cobbitty, nestled on the Nepean River, attracts much interest because of the lush country views and beautifully kept historic buildings. Stroll through the markets held on the first Saturday of the month (excluding January and February).

Gledswood Homestead and Winery, circa 1810, is an historic property set on 113 acres. The convict-built sandstone homestead is surrounded by sweeping lawns and gardens. Visitors can explore the historic homestead, convict quarters and cellar door operating from the Coach House

Originally named 'Buckingham', the property now 'Gledswood' was a grant of 400 acres made to Gabriel Louis Marie Huon de Kerillian in 1810. De Kerillian was a French nobleman who fled the Revolution and joined the NSW Corps as Gabriel Lewis, arriving on the 'Surprise' in 1794. He was at one time a tutor to John Macarthur's sons. De



Kerillian was issued with eight convicts who constructed a residence on the property. This first building later became the kitchen for the homestead. The second building was a coach house and the third a cottage for the convicts in which they were chained at night.

These buildings still stand and are distinguished from later buildings because they are made from local sandstone. In 1816, the property was sold to James Chisholm for £250.

Street. The park is well known for its heritage rose garden.

The cusped hammerbeam roof trusses were cut from local ironbark trees. The church has many stained-glass windows, including a pair of windows in the original design made in England. The later windows are of local design.







To see the jacarandas in bloom, we recommend visiting Macarthur Park as well as John Street and Argyle Street in Camden Town Centre.

NATURAL AREAS

The Botanic Garden has an interesting mosaic of natural areas that have their own intrinsic value. These woodland and native grassland areas contribute to the landscape, character and visitor experience of the garden. These areas of remnant native vegetation are becoming

increasingly rare in western Sydney as urban development continues, and the garden is now important for species' conservation and fauna habitat.



WILDLIFE

The Australian Botanic Garden Mount Annan has become an increasingly valuable green space in a fast-growing urban area. The size of the site and interesting variety of landscapes have made it an important fauna refuge. More than 160 bird species have been seen in the garden, and visitors can take advantage of the lakes, woodlands and grasslands to see this wide range of bird life. Native mammals such as the wallaroo and swamp wallaby are commonly seen in their natural woodland and grassland habitats.

AUSTRALIAN PLANTBANK

Built in 2013, the Australian PlantBank is an international centre for plant research and learning, incorporating the largest native plant conservation seedbank in Australia. Visitors of all ages are welcome to participate in a free tour to learn about the important conservation work being undertaken.





Miss Llewella Davies was an energetic member of the Camden community and

this walkway is a key part of honouring her. It continues her legacy of community participation while maintaining its significant heritage value.

The walkway weaves through 2.4km of the Camden Town Farm with three walking tracks including the 250m long Nepean River Link, the 800m long Matahill Creek Loop and the Elizabeth Street Farm Link which is 1.3km.

The walkway is open every day during daylight hours except for rare times where cattle need to be moved between paddocks or other agricultural operations are taking place.




